Adapting to your environment •

An adaptation is a change in the organism's body or behaviour that helps it to survive. It can be structural, which means it is related to a physical part of the organism. An example of a structural adaptation is the way some plants have adapted to life in dry, hot deserts. They have adapted to this climate by storing water in their short, thick stems and leaves.

An adaptation can also be behavioral, affecting the way an organism responds to its environment. Building nests, communicating with one another, ways of finding food, and seasonal migration are examples of behavioural adaptation. For example, gray whales migrate thousands of kilometers every year to the warm waters off the coast of Mexico.

Animals can react to climate change in only three ways: they can move, adapt or die. Because moving isn't always a simple solution, in the harsh cold climate of Alaska, the animals have learnt to adapt to the weather by storing food in their body and protecting **themselves** from the cold with thick furs. Human inhabitants in Alaska have also learnt to cope with the environment by building shelters that hold the heat inside, and yet do not allow the structure to melt.

Our Story

A few years ago, a committee headed by Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah became the core team to develop an idea about the story of Jordan in a new way; a new modern museum. The Jordan museum is a dream that comes true. The Jordan Museum intends to enable its guests to experience Jordanian culture and history in a lively way. It presents the Kingdom's history and heritage as part of the story of Jordan's past, present, and future. It's rough and smooth stones stand for the past and present while the future is represented by glass.

The museum is located in the Ras Al-Ein area, near downtown Amman. It is the largest museum in Jordan. The country's most important archaeological findings are found in this museum. <u>It</u> was officially opened in 2014 CE. Animal bones dating back to 1.5 million years are hosted in the museum.
